Connecting2Tomorrow became involved with the PAR program at the Butler School District in 2012. The PAR program is an alternative educational setting to aid students in addressing attendance, behavior and academic concerns so that they can return to the building setting and gain the skills needed to be successful in life. During the 2012-2013 school year, we have provided topics and discussions on: Motivation, Career Interest, Team Building, Leadership, Conflict Resolution, Protecting Your Identity, Resume Writing, Mock Interviewing, Work Ethics, and more.

Beginning in February, the PAR students were involved in a project with Soldiers' Angels. The students of Butler School District collected items such as personal hygiene items, snacks, magazines, books, playing cards, etc. Over 9500 items were donated. Needless to say, the project was success!

It was a pleasure to be a part of this project! The PAR students worked diligently on packing and sorting all of these items. After 10 days, the last item was packed and 206 boxes were taped, labeled and sealed with custom forms. The packages will be shipped to troops serving in Afghanistan and to the aircraft carrier The USS Dwight D. Eisenhower. 7000 troops will benefit by this project.

Being a part of such a huge project was great, but watching the students work together as a team, putting their leadership skills into action and giving back to their community and country was priceless. Local Soldiers' visited the students while they were working to personally thank them for their efforts. The troops emailed the students to thank them and say they were looking forward to the packages. The items are not only helpful, but they are a big morale booster, as well.
